This is an historic event for which I have long wished and prayed, but until Cindy and I started dating in August of 2021, I doubted would ever come to fruition. I think it's fair to say I am a mix of emotions. Worshippers here have been part of our relationship these past 15 months or so. Therefore, I wanted to share with you our good news, in case you hadn't heard it and tell you a little more about my future bride.

Cindy is the executive director of GroundWorks Connect, a nonprofit organization she co-founded in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, more than 12 years ago while she was in seminary. The organization builds a bridge between agricultural producers and educators to teach students where their food comes from. (For instance, Cindy loves to tell 10-year-olds how soil becomes a cheese burger.) There are four components to GroundWorks Connect: 1. Cindy and her team develop and deploy ag-in-the-classroom curriculum for South Dakota fourth graders through an online presence that is seen by more than just the 95% of South Dakota's fourth-graders who register for it. This webbased curriculum is viewed even by people in other states and countries. 2. Teaching gardens at 23 locations, all of which are within a 90-minute drive of either Sioux Falls or Rapid City. 3. Youth Eating Smart (YES) camps in the summer and 4. Annual continuing-education conferences that literally connect ag-industry professionals with educators and teach them how to support each other's missions.

In addition to that, Cindy is a certified teacher with seven different endorsements; and she is a trained chaplain, having experience at Sanford Hospital in Sioux Falls.

Cindy holds two bachelor's degrees from South Dakota State University -- a Bachelor of Arts degree in speech communications studies and theatre and another in English education. She also holds a Master of Divinity degree from Sioux Falls Seminary, specializing in pastoral care and counseling.

Cindy is a candidate to be commissioned as a clergy member of the Dakotas Conference of The United Methodist Church as early as next June. Cindy is seeking to be ordained to the order of permanent deacon, which is a clergy order of equal standing with elders like me, but with a different focus.

Rather than ordering the life of the local church, Cindy's ministry will build a bridge between church and community. She will do that by living the gospel and bringing it to those on the margins of society and inviting those on the margins to the fellowship of the church.

Cindy has two sons: Xavier, 19; and Atticus, 16. Xavier lives with Cindy in a farm house about 14 miles west of Sioux Falls, SD. He worked at Wesley Acres Camp last summer. Largely because of that experience and his special interest in individuals with special needs, he is now working as a direct-support person for Lifescape, which is a non-profit providing services much like Open Door Center in Valley City. Atticus lives part-time with Cindy and part-time with his father in Lennox, SD, where he is a junior in the public school. We do not intend to transfer Atticus from the school in which he is a good student and a starter on the football team, nor do we intend for Cindy to live 4 ½ hours away from a child in his senior year of high school. So, we are prepared to live apart, if necessary, to fulfill our calls to career and family.

I met Cindy in January of 2008 when she was the director of Christian education at Sioux Falls Asbury United Methodist Church, the church that launched us and many others into the ordained ministry.

Sometimes God's grace surprises us with a love, a career, or even a faith late in life. The parable in Matthew 20 about the workers all getting the same benefit regardless of when

they started seems to suggest that it's never too late.

Epworth Supports Camps

We had a great summer at our United Methodist Camps. Thirty-seven campers associated with Epworth had 51 registrations at 11 different camps or events. (This includes 14 adults.) That means we had 10 campers who attended more than one camp. It also means that on average, for each camp attended by an Epworth camper, there were three other Epworth campers at the same event. Included in this number are 14 people who attended Youth2023 and 10 who attended Circle of Friends Camp for individuals with special needs.

I am grateful that our United Women in Faith and our United Methodist Men sponsor half the early-bird registration costs for all the camps a person attends during the summer. (That excludes the school-year youth events of Winter Connection and DAK Youth.) Camp is one of the missions supported by fundraisers such as the bazaar and the French Toast breakfast. Each year Epworth raises thousands of dollars to fund Christian camping in the Dakotas Conference where lives change at places set apart.

Our Dakotas Conference owns three camp sites, Wesley Acres, near Dazey; Storm Mountain Center near Rapid City, SD; and Lake Poinsett Camp, between Watertown and Brookings, SD. Wesley Acres is directed by the Rev. Paul and Brenda Lint, and Storm Mountain is directed by Tanner Clark, one of our professing members. Directors at both those sites are members here. Epworth campers attended events at both Wesley Acres and Lake Poinsett this year, as well as off-site events for Winter Connection and Youth2023.

In addition to that, several young adults connected to Epworth were employed as summer staff at Wesley Acres including Xavier Larson (Cindy Heidelberger's oldest child), Micah and Gideon Lint, Grace Mueller, and Camille Zachrison.

World Communion Sunday Oct. 1

We will celebrate World Communion Sunday on Sunday, Oct. 1. The observance focuses the attention of United Methodists on the universal and inclusive nature of the church. So, we will celebrate with holy communion during worship and a special offering for the denomination. This is one of the eight special offerings we take during the year set by our bishop, annual conference, or general conference.

The money for this special offering goes to scholarships. Half of the money raised supports two scholarship funds of the General Board of Global Ministries. One of those funds provides scholarships for Methodist church members seeking to obtain a post-graduate degree and then serve the church and community in some form after their studies. Another fund offers money for students seeking an undergraduate degree, post-graduate degree or are enrolled in either a professional or leadership-development program.

Successful candidates for these scholarship funds envision their work supporting one of the following four ministry foci set for the church by the Council of Bishops: 1) combating the diseases of poverty by improving health globally, 2) engaging in ministry with the poor, 3) creating new places for people and renewal of existing local churches, and 4) developing principled Christian leaders for the church and the world.

The other half of the money funds minority scholarships administered by the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry. This money supports small scholarships (\$500-\$900) to qualified United Methodist ethnic/racial minorities in undergraduate institutions and larger grants (up to \$2,000) for the same population enrolled in training programs for chaplaincy and/or pastoral counseling.

All Saints Sunday Nov. 5

Suicide Prevention Walk Oct. 8

The American Foundation for Suicide Prevention is hosting an "Out of the Darkness" walk on Sunday, Oct. 8 at 3 p.m. at the Lokken Stadium of the Valley City State University Campus (across the street south of Epworth). The AFSP says: "The Out of the Darkness Community Walk is a journey of remembrance, hope, and support. It unites our communities and provides an opportunity to acknowledge the ways in which suicide and mental health conditions have affected our lives and the lives of those we love and care about."

This walk also raises funds for the foundation's work at preventing suicide. For instance, every \$50 provides AFSP educational materials for 25 people. To give, you may go to https://supporting.afsp.org/. Of every dollar raised, 83 cents directly support four focus areas: Research, advocacy, education, and support. AFSP has an "A" rating from Charity Watch and a top rating of four stars from Charity Navigator.

The United Methodist Church has an obligation to address this issue and seeks to remove the oppressive stigma around suicide. In our latest *Book of Discipline, the church says: "We deplore the condemnation of people who complete suicide, and we consider unjust the stigma that so often falls on surviving family and friends."*



Church Family Supper


