

Gifts—Thank you, so much, for the generous gifts and kind words that the pastor and staff received this past Christmas. We also thank those of you who brought food



to the staff-appreciation potluck on Dec. 10. Knowing we are appreciated really helps us feel as though the work is worthwhile and keeps us going. These gifts also help us feel seen and loved for the persons we are, distinct from the work we do.

Practices Changing to Keep Us All Safer—

In our effort to offer a safe, secure environment that spiritually nourishes everyone, including vulnerable populations, Epworth has made some changes to certain practices as of Dec. 10. This was a result of a recent awareness that some of our previous practices put our children, youth, and vulnerable adults at risk, especially to those persons unknown to us who may find our materials on the Internet. Some internet users unfortunately are becoming increasingly crafty in using online-posted personally identifiable information to steal identities or harm people in other ways. We wouldn't want that to happen to anyone because of participation in worship here.

We will soon empanel a task force of people with knowledge and vested interest in these topics. That task force will update their training in these issues and then update our Safer Sanctuary Policy (designed to protect everyone, especially vulnerable populations). I imagine these practices will be part of our discussion about what we do and why.

So, until further notice, we will not publish children's names in the worship guide, nor dates listed in the birthdays.

Christmas Eve Offering to Feed

People—Undesignated offerings received at our Christmas Eve service do not go to current expenses. These offerings are a gift to some other agency or person to accomplish a specific ministry. For instance, in 2022, we raised more than \$3,300 from our three Christmas Eve services and specific gifts. These offerings supported Rydel Samuelson, who was finishing his seminary career. (Rydel is now a licensed local pastor serving the Wagner-Tyndall charge in southcentral South Dakota).

This year, the Servant Leadership Team has decided to split the offering between the Backpack Program and the Barnes County Food Pantry. So, any undesignated gifts given during the Christmas Eve service (at 5 p.m. on Dec. 24 in the Epworth Sanctuary) will be split between these two feeding ministries. Also, as always, we will distribute any gifts given specifically to these causes regardless of when they are given.

The Backpack program currently provides 226 packs of meals each month in the backpacks of children on the last day of school each week. This is to supplement nutrition in homes that may be foodinsecure. Some of these homes wouldn't be able to provide adequate nutrition to these students without the backpack meals. When the major benefactor to this program shifted its generosity away from this non-profit, opportunities opened to broaden the donor base for this program. The Barnes County Food Pantry, a program of the non-profit South Central Adult Services, provides nutritional sustenance and personal items to eligible individuals and families in need. Monetary donations will be used to purchase price-reduced, overstocked items from area grocery food distributors. So, these donations provide the Food Pantry with the flexibility to purchase those needed items in short supply.
