

From the Pastor's Pen

People say you don't realize how important health is until it suddenly turns poor. We don't realize how vital respiration is until we are short of breath. At this time of year, I realize the importance of light. Throughout the year, I crave light. I expect it. And I take it for granted until the dark early mornings and sudden evenings of winter steal much of our daily light supply. Not only are there fewer daylight hours during the winter, but the skies are more apt to be overcast during this season.

As I've preached before, that is one of the reasons the early Christians placed Christmas so close to the winter solstice on the calendar. Early Christians liked the pagan Roman idea of having a festival of light (Saturnalia) in the midst of a dark season.

We are living now in a dark season, not just in our weather, but in our world, as well. But in the midst of that, we celebrate Epiphany on Jan. 6. Before Jan. 6 represented the anniversary of 2021's deadly riot at the U.S. Capitol, it meant Epiphany – the end of the 12 days of Christmas. Those 12 days represent the journey of the magi, who took as long as two years to travel from Persia to Bethlehem, following the light of Christ.

We still have that light. In fact, this time of year, we need that light, literally and spiritually. God shines light into our dark world. God continually chases away the darkness and creates something new when we thought there was no way. Christmas represents that. Epiphany represents that, too, in a slightly different way. Epiphany reflects the effect of God's incarnation into human flesh. Epiphany means that the darkness of this world will not last forever. That gives us hope – hope that already the earth is tilting this northern hemisphere back toward the sun. So, the days are already lengthening. God will not abandon us to the darkness forever. We have the light of Christ shining through into our lives, into this new year, into our future.

The few weeks between Epiphany and Lent, I often think of as a season of Epiphany. Liturgically, we display green paraments because it is a season of using the light for growth (of spiritual and discipleship natures). Experts in liturgy call it "ordinary time" (meaning the weeks fall in a certain order – first Sunday after Epiphany, second Sunday after Epiphany, etc.), but I like to think of the whole season as a season of light. That's what I crave during this season.

So, let us celebrate the light as we move together into what I like to think of as an Epiphany season.

Practices Changing to Keep Us All Safer

In our effort to offer a safe, secure environment that spiritually nourishes everyone, including vulnerable populations, Epworth has made some changes to certain practices as of Dec. 10. This was a result of a recent awareness that some of our previous practices put our children, youth, and vulnerable adults at risk, especially to those persons unknown to us who may find our materials on the Internet. Some internet users unfortunately are becoming increasingly crafty in using online-posted personally identifiable information to steal identities or harm people in other ways. We wouldn't want that to happen to anyone because of participation in worship here.

We will soon empanel a task force of people with knowledge and vested interest in these topics. That task force will update their training in these issues and then update our Safer Sanctuary Policy (designed to protect everyone, especially vulnerable populations). I imagine these practices will be part of our discussion about what we do and why.

So, until further notice, we will not publish children's names in the worship guide, nor dates listed in the birthdays.


We will resume Sunday School on January 7th at 9:00am after the break. We will continue on our journey through the Bible and all of Jesus' teachings!

An associate member is a member of another denomination who wishes to come into official fellowship of a United Methodist Church, expect its pastoral care and oversight and to participate in its activities, including the holding of office, except as a voting member of the local church governing body or a United Methodist structure beyond the local church. Furthermore, associate members do not enjoy the same due-process rights as professing members. Therefore, the associate membership may be terminated at the discretion of the local church or when the member moves from this vicinity.

Nielson joined by transfer of membership from Berthold Baptist Church in Berthold, N.D. Osborne joined by transfer of membership from St. John's United Methodist Church in Wimbledon, N.D. The Thorsons had been members of the now closed Page (North Dakota) United Methodist Church for years, but officially joined on profession of faith because there was no record of their membership being appropriately transferred to an open United Methodist Church at the time of Page's closing.


